- They are not workers.
 - He isn't from Ireland.
 - Is he a student? Yes, he is./ No, he isn't.
 - Are you a pilot? Yes, I am./ No, I'm not.

Note:

I'm not = I am not	He isn't = He is not
She isn't = She is not	It isn't = It is not
We aren't = We are not	You aren't = You are not
They aren't = They are not	

TO BE (am, is, are) - Questions with question words:

When What Why Where Who + be + S + ... ? How old How

- Ex:
- Where are you from? I'm from Thailand.
 - What's your surname? My surname is Jefferson.
 - What's his job? He is a doctor.
 - How old is he? He is two.

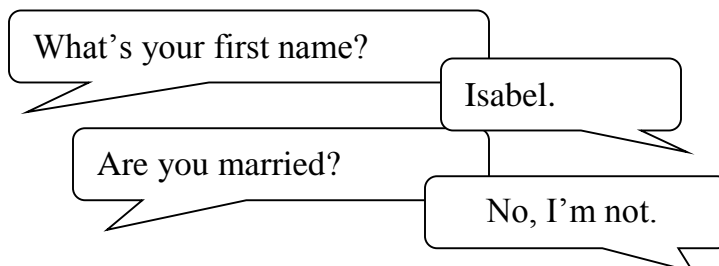

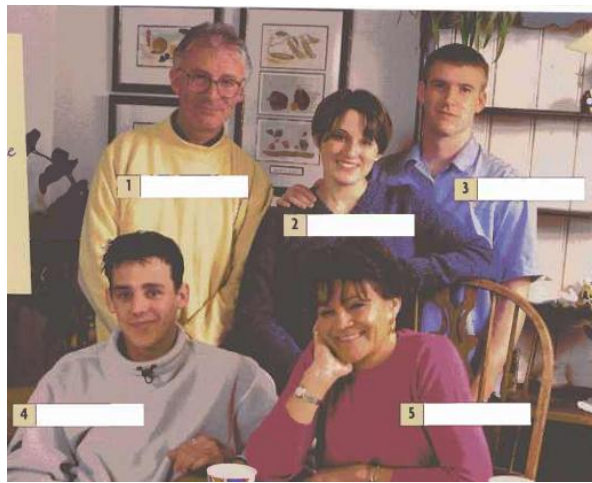

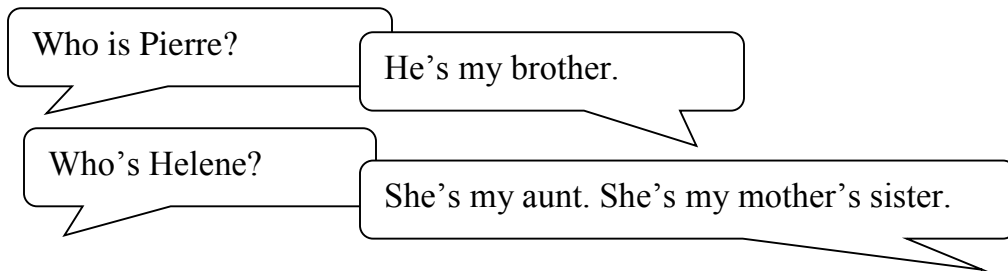
