


Comparatives and superlatives

- 1. Short adjectives
- Example: cheap → cheaper → the cheapest

fast \rightarrow faster \rightarrow the fastest

• Form:

* Note:

- If an adjective ending in "y" and before "y" is a consonant, we change "y" \rightarrow "i" then add "-er"/ "-est"

Ex: dry → drier/ driest

But: grey→ greyer / greyest

- If an adjective ending in "-e" we just add "-r"/ "-st"

EX: safe → safer/ safest

wide → wider/ widest

If an adjective ending in one vowel + one consonant, we need to double the last consonant of the adjective then add "-er"/ "-est"

EX: big → bigger/ biggest

hot → hotter/ hottest


2. Long adjectives

EX: useful → more useful → the most useful expensive → more expensive → the most expensive dangerous → more dangerous → the most dangerous

Form: more / the most + long adj


