We didn't finish our homework yesterday.
Did you move house last night? - Yes, I did.

## Form:

| $(+)$ Positive | S + V (-ed) $+\ldots$ |
| :--- | :--- |
| $(-)$ Negative | S + didn't + V (inf) $+\ldots$ |
| (?) Question and answer | Did $+\mathbf{S}+\mathrm{V}$ (inf) $+\ldots ?$ |
|  | Yes, $\mathrm{S}+$ did. |
|  | No, $\mathrm{S}+$ didn't. |

Spelling of regular verbs:

- The normal rule is to add $-\mathbf{e d}$. If the verb ends in $\boldsymbol{e}$, add $-\mathbf{d}$.

\text { work }- \text { worked } & \text { start }- \text { started } \\
\text { love }- \text { loved } & \text { live }- \text { lived }
\end{array}
$$

- If the verb has only one syllable and one vowel and one consonant, double the consonant.

$$
\text { stop }- \text { stopped } \quad \text { plan }- \text { planned }
$$

- Verbs that end in a consonant $+\boldsymbol{y}$ are change to - ied.
study - studied carry - carried


## Past Simple of irregular verbs:

Ex:
He bought some books last year.
We sold our house 3 days ago.
I didn't go out yesterday.
Did you come to my house last night? - Yes, I did.

## Form:

| $(+)$ Positive | S + V (P.S - column 2) $+\ldots$ |
| :--- | :--- |
| $(-)$ Negative | S + didn't $+\mathbf{V}($ inf $)+\ldots$ |
| (?) Question | Did $+\mathbf{S}+\mathbf{V}($ (inf $)+\ldots ?$ |
| and answer | Yes, $S+$ did. |
|  | No, $S+$ didn't. |

## Rules of pronunciation of "-ed":

- If the verbs ending in $/ \mathrm{t}, \mathrm{d} /$ are added -ed, -ed is pronounced /id/.

$$
\text { hate }- \text { hated } \quad \text { start }- \text { started } \quad \text { want }- \text { wanted }
$$

- If the verbs ending in / th, ch, sh, s, k, p, f/ are added -ed, -ed is pronounced / t/.

$$
\text { work }- \text { worked } \quad \text { talk }- \text { talked } \quad \text { watch }- \text { watched }
$$

- If the verbs ending in voiced sounds are added -ed, -ed is pronounced / $\mathbf{d} /$.

$$
\text { live }- \text { lived } \quad \text { love }- \text { loved } \quad \text { marry }- \text { married }
$$
