## Can/ Can't; Could/ Couldn't.

Ex: I can run very well.
He can play the piano.
They could buy a big house in 1990 .
She could speak English when she five years old.
We can't sing that song.
I couldn't ride a horse last year.
Can you play tennis with me?
Could you write poetry when you ten?

## Form:

| (+) Positive | S + can/ could + V (inf). |
| :--- | :--- |
| (-) Negative | S + can’t/ couldn't + V (inf). |
|  |  |
| (?) Question and answer | Can/ Could + S + V (inf)? <br>  <br>  <br>  <br> $\quad$ Yes, $S+$ can/could. |
| No, $S+$ can't/ couldn't. |  |

Note:

- Can and Can't have the same form in all persons. There is no Do or Does. Can is followed by the infinitive (without to).
- Could is the past of Can. Could and Couldn't have the same form in all persons. Could is followed by the infinitive (without to).

| (+) Positive | $\mathrm{S}+$ was/were + V (inf). |
| :--- | :--- |
| $(-)$ Negative | $\mathrm{S}+$ wasn't/weren't + V (inf). |
| (?) Question | Was/Were + S + V (inf)? |
| and answer | Yes, S + was/were. |
|  | No, S + wasn't/ weren't. |

Note: Was/ Were is the past of $\mathrm{am} / \mathrm{is} /$ are.
